

## **Thoughts to Consider**

## Who is your researcher?

- What's their experience level?
- What do they want?
- How much are they willing to invest?

## What is your staff situation?

- Does each person have a specific role?
- Who do you need in the room (or on the Zoom call) to make decisions?

## What's your workflow?

- Are there staff or administrative hurdles?
- Is your instance hosted?
- Do you have technical hurdles?

### Ways to Help Your Researchers

Add info to your ArchivesSpace landing page or website Primer on archives/archival terminology Be dynamic! Add a video or PDF

Easy access to archivists - make contact info easily accessible Describe the various entry points Show Advanced Search options, including Boolean phases

- Metadata!
- Digital Objects
- Cater towards your researchers and your institution

## How Can ArchivesSpace Fields Help?

### Subject/Agent Records

Helps when researchers want to see all records on specific person, organization, or subject

#### **Notes Fields**

Lots of wiggle room here to add plethora of information

### **Accession Records**

Gives context, even if Resource Records aren't available yet

### Classifications

Group materials to help researchers better grasp materials

The Archives Research Center's collections primarily document the African American experience through civil rights, race relations, education, literature, visual and performing arts, religion, politics, and social work. The holdings include books, manuscript collections, digital collections, and materials documenting the Atlanta University Center schools, as well as the African American and African Diasporic experience. The core of our manuscript holdings are built upon the Atlanta University Trevor Arnett Library's Negro Collection. These resources contain letters, photographs, writings, yearbooks, programs, minutes, and much more. Under the auspices of the Atlanta University Center Robert W. Woodruff Library, the archival and manuscript holdings continue to develop and expand.
