
#### Say hello to 2.8.0

## New in 2.8.0: Merging top containers






### New in 2.8.0: AND in the public user interface

- Search operator in public interface is now AND
  - Changed based on feedback from many but you can change back to OR in your ArchivesSpace if you prefer
- Thanks to Mark Cooper of LYRASIS DTS, who worked closely with us before Laney's departure and has been working with us nearly full-time since March.

#### More browse and search preferences


- More to choose in staff interface display preferences, including dates, extents, and sorts, plus preferences for search.

#### Community developer spotlight: **Andrew Morrison**

#### **Community Contributions**

Our great thanks go out to these members of the community for their code contributions:

Narrowing PUI search by multiple values in the same facet, adding a language facet, and date filter fixes; make displaying search-in-collection form configurable option in other contexts on the PUI; change logic for when dao/daogrp/daolink get "internal" audience attributes; modify the view published button in the staff interface toolbar; fix linking issues in subject and agent records; add "nofollow" rel attribute to links in facets/filters in PUI; pass resource record to PUI PDF footer template; enable Luke request handler thanks to Andrew Morrison

- Rare that a community developer essentially gets their own paragraph in the release notes -- but it's also rare that a community developer submits more than a half dozen excellent pull requests for one release.
- Andrew (University of Oxford) is a new membér of our Technical Advisory Council as well.



### Community developer spotlight: Harvard University Team

- Harvard archivists and developers distributed a specification for enhancements to the containers and locations areas that they distributed to the community for comment and improved based on feedback.
- 2.8.0 has the first set of improvements and we expect the rest to be in our next release.
- Thanks to Katie Amaral, Dee Dee Crema, Dave Mayo, Douglas Simon, Michael Vandermillen, and project manager Robin Wendler for working to make sure code their users wanted would also work for the core code of ArchivesSpace.






#### Speaking of which...

- Next release projected for the fall probably ArchivesSpace 3.0
- Centerpiece will be the long-awaited expanded agents module and its significantly improved support for EAC-CPF and MARC authority records
- Expect to also have some enhancements to the spreadsheet importer, some infrastructure improvements, the remaining pieces of the work from Harvard. Other improvements to be determined.


## Some of the initiatives and activities coming this year

- Building a National Finding Aid Network project
  - Led by California Digital Library
  - Two-year project funded by IMLS
  - ArchivesSpace serving as a technical advisor
  - Will involve the regional aggregators in which many of your institutions participate
  - Making it easier to aggregate archival description from ArchivesSpace, or at least contribute it to an aggregator, will likely be one of the positive outcomes
