What's a Technology and Development Roadmap?

- Provides an overview of development work over a period of time
 - What work is planned
 - Who's responsible
 - Where it is in the process
 - When it is forecast to be in the application
- Encompasses work users see in the application and work they don't





Why Do We Need a Roadmap?

- Serves as a planning and communication tool for both the program and those using (or considering using) the application
- Useful for
 - Planning for upgrades
 - Determining next steps for a particular feature and when it's likely to be available for use
 - Identifying ways to get involved in specific development projects
 - Working groups and writing requirements
 - Opportunities for community developers
 - Opportunities for contractors





The Development Planning Process and How That Relates to the Roadmap

- In conjunction with our development catalog JIRA (http://development.archivesspace.org)
 - Users report individual issues as well as submit larger projects or requests to the ArchivesSpace Program Team
- Development Prioritization subteam meets monthly to discuss issues and larger projects as appropriate
- ArchivesSpace program team determines likely timelines based on prioritization, project readiness and available resources





The Development Planning Process

- ArchivesSpace program team assigns developers
- Developers work under the guidance of the Tech Lead and Program Manager
 - Deliver development for testing by Testing subteam and others
 - When testing determines work is ready, it goes into a release
- ArchivesSpace program team updates the roadmap as releases come out and planning for individual projects progresses

Iterative process





New ArchivesSpace Roadmap

- Our roadmap has evolved as our community and the communication and planning needs around development – have grown
- Our new roadmap is a series of views generated from one Excel file to help different kinds of ArchivesSpace stakeholders


The Views: Full Details

- Intended primarily for
 - Power ArchivesSpace users and developers
- Will be especially helpful for
 - Seeing the full picture of development being considered and worked on
 - Tracking a particular feature through the development process
 - Identifying opportunities for you or your institution to get involved in the development process





The Views: Annual Overview






The Views: Annual Overview

- Intended primarily for
 - Administrators, system administrators and others who need to know how ArchivesSpace application has evolved or is intended to evolve over a period of time but are less directly involved from day to day
- Will be especially helpful for
 - Planning for upgrades
 - Getting a big picture view of development for the year or another specified period of time
 - Providing a sense of level of activity to financial stakeholders when considering membership, hosting, or other outlays of funds





The Views: Release-Specific








The Views: Release-Specific

- Intended primarily for users and system administrators who want to know what is in – or planned to be in – each release
- Release notes will continue to be the fullest and more accurate representation of the actual releases
- Will be especially helpful for
 - Planning for upgrades
 - Comparing where you are now with the most current releases
 - Determining whether a particular release can be delayed/skipped or should be prioritized based on local interests/needs





The Views: Impact of Enhancements







The Views: Impact of Enhancements

- Intended for high-level administrators and others less involved with the application or with archives in general
- Will be especially helpful for
 - Giving a visual sense of the relative effort given to different categories of development and identifying releases that provide the most impact
 - Giving a visual sense of how actively the application is being developed





What's Next/Where Else to Look

- Updated views will be posted after every release and previous views will be archived
 - Each release will continue to be accompanied by release notes that provide the most detailed listing of what's in each release
 - All development will continue to be tracked in JIRA and GitHub JIRA and GitHub are the places to reports issues and commit specific code to address them
- We will be promoting specific development projects and issues for community involvement in other ways in addition to the roadmap
